Jesse Martins is a conductor, pianist, and voice coach who has extensive experience working with all types of singers from children to experienced professionals.



Since joining the music staff of Sarasota Opera in 2011, he has been integrally involved in all aspects of the company's musicmaking. He conducted Mozart's *Die Zauberflöte* for the Winter Festival, and in the upcoming season he will conduct Donizetti's *La fille du régiment*.

As Youth Opera Music Director for Sarasota Opera, Maestro Martins has conducted the world premiere of Rachel J. Peters' *Rootabga Country*, the U.S. premiere of Dean Burry's *The Secret*

World of OG, Britten's The Little Sweep, Dean Burry's The Hobbit, Krása's Brundibár and was the associate conductor for the world premiere of Daron Hagen's Little Nemo in Slumberland. He also co-wrote, in collaboration with Martha Collins, and conducted two works for the Sarasota Youth Opera Raise Up Your Voice – Intolerance Through the Voices of Children, and Let's Put on an Opera. As part of the music staff Martins was the cover conductor for Rossini's Il barbiere di Siviglia, and L'italiana in Algeri, Mozart's Le nozze di Figaro, Eugene D'Albert's Tiefland, and Catalani's La Wally.

He was the Chorus Master & Head of the Apprentice Program during the 2020 Winter Festival and has performed as pianist in many concerts for the company and throughout the area. This fall he will collaborate in concerts at the opera house.

Maestro Martins has worked extensively as a coach in his native Brazil, New Zealand, and now the Sarasota opera and area.

Betsy Hudson Traba has served as Principal Flutist of the Sarasota Orchestra and Sarasota Wind Ouintet since 1993. She is the former Principal Flutist of the Hofer Symphoniker in Hof, Germany, where she performed as a featured soloist on nine concerts during a two-year period. A native of Cleveland, Ohio, she studied with William Hebert and Jeffrey Khaner while earning a Bachelor of Music degree from Baldwin-Wallace College, followed by a Master of Music degree earned at the



Manhattan School of Music as a student of Julius Baker. Ms. Traba has been heard frequently as a soloist throughout Florida, including guest artist performances with the La Musica International Chamber Music Festival, Artist's Series of Sarasota, EnsembleNEWSRQ, and in multiple performances with the Sarasota Orchestra. From 2008-2018 she performed every summer at the Cabrillo Festival of Contemporary Music in Santa Cruz, CA.

Ms. Traba is an active teacher working locally with flutists of all ages and has served multiple terms as a leader of the Sarasota Orchestra Musicians' Committee. She originated and lectures as part of the popular Symphonic Life series of classes offered by the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at Ringling College, and since 2019 has been engaged to write program notes for Sarasota Orchestra's Masterworks Series concerts. She is married to Sarasota Orchestra Principal Bassoonist Fernando Traba, and they have 2 daughters, ages 17 and 19.

Fernando Traba has served as **Principal Bassoon** of the Sarasota Orchestra since 1992. A native of Mexico City, Mexico, Mr. Traba has held posts as **Principal Bassoon** with all five major orchestras in Mexico City, as well as the Orchestra of the Principality of Asturias in Oviedo, Spain, the National



Opera Orchestra in Lisbon, Portugal and the Orquesta Sinfónica de Minería in Mexico City. He has performed many of the major bassoon concertos with orchestras in Mexico, Europe and the United States. An avid chamber musician, Mr. Traba has been a member of the Sarasota Wind Quintet since 1992. He has also performed with The Instrumenta Music Festival in Puebla, Mexico, the Palm Beach Chamber Music Festival and is a regular guest artist with ChamberFest Cleveland.

Mr. Traba holds Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from The Cleveland Institute of Music and has done postgraduate work at the Juilliard School. In addition to his performing career, he is serving as Adjunct Bassoon Faculty at the University of South Florida for the 2020-2021 school year. Mr. Traba has served on the faculty of Department of Music at Florida Southern College since 2000, and also teaches bassoon at the State College of Florida and Polk State College.

He has edited and provided the Spanish language translation for the 2nd edition of *Bassoon Reed Making: Basic Technique* by Christopher Weait.

He is married to Sarasota Orchestra Principal Flutist Betsy Hudson Traba and they have two daughters, ages 17 and 19.
