A gripping memoir of survival and perseverance about the heroic young inventor who brought electricity to his Malawian village.

To Kill a Mockingbird by Harper Lee*
The explosion of racial hate and violence in a small Alabama town is viewed by a little girl whose father defends a black man accused of rape.

The Sun is Also a Star by Nicola Yoon
Natasha is a girl who believes in science and facts. Daniel has always been a good son and good student. But when he sees Natasha he forgets all that and believes there is something extraordinary in store for both of them.

Divergent by Veronica Roth
In a future Chicago, Beatrice Prior must choose among five predetermined factions to define her identity for the rest of her life, a decision made more difficult when she discovers that she is an anomaly who does not fit into any one group, and that the society she lives in is not perfect after all.

Normal People by Sally Rooney*
A connection grows between Connell and Marianne that they are determined to conceal. A year later, they're both studying at Trinity College in Dublin. Marianne and Connell magnetically, irresistibly circle one another for years.

Little Women by Louisa May Alcott
Chronicles the joys and sorrows of the four March sisters as they grow into young women in mid-nineteenth-century New England.

A Wrinkle in Time by Madeleine L'Engle

Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone by J.K. Rowling

Percy Jackson and the Olympians: The Lightning Thief by Rick Riordan
Twelve-year-old Percy Jackson learns he is a demigod, the son of a mortal woman and Poseidon, god of the sea. His mother sends him to a summer camp for demigods where he and his new friends set out on a quest to prevent a war between the gods.

13 Reasons Why by Jay Asher
When Clay Jensen receives a box containing thirteen cassette tapes recorded by his classmate Hannah, who committed suicide, he spends the night crisscrossing their town, listening to Hannah's voice recounting the events leading up to her death.

Looking for Alaska by John Green
Sixteen-year-old Miles' first year at Culver Creek Preparatory School in Alabama includes good friends and great pranks, but is defined by the search for answers about life and death after a fatal car crash.

Artemis Fowl by Eoin Colfer
When a twelve-year-old evil genius tries to restore his family fortune by capturing a fairy and demanding a ransom in gold, the fairies fight back with magic, technology, and a particularly nasty troll.

Stargirl by Jerry Spinelli
In this story about the perils of popularity, the courage of nonconformity, and the thrill of first love, an eccentric student named Stargirl changes Mica High School forever.

Enola Holmes: The case of the missing marquess by Nancy Springer
The younger sister of detective Sherlock Holmes must travel to London in disguise to unravel the disappearance of her missing mother.

All the Bright Places by Jennifer Niven
Meeting on the ledge of their school's bell tower, misfit Theodore Finch and suicidal Violet Markey find acceptance and healing that are overshadowed by Finch's fears about Violet's growing social world.

Five Feet Apart by Rachael Lippincott
Seventeen-year-olds Stella and Will, both suffering from cystic fibrosis, realize the only way to stay alive is to stay apart, but their love for each other is slowly pushing the boundaries of physical and emotional safety.

The Baby-Sitters Club: Kristy's Great Idea by Ann M. Martin, art by Raina Telgemeier
Kristy, Mary Anne, Claudia, and Stacey are best friends and founding members of The Baby-sitters Club. Whatever comes up, you can count on them to save the day.

Simon Vs. The Homo Sapiens Agenda by Becky Albertalli
Sixteen-year-old, not-so-openly-gay Simon Spier is blackmailed into playing wingman for his classmate or else his sexual identity--and that of his pen pal--will be revealed.

Always and Forever, Lara Jean by Jenny Han
While helping plan her father's wedding, senior Lara Jean struggles with choosing a college and questions how graduation is going to change her relationship with her boyfriend Peter.

The Letter for the King by Tonke Dragt
The thrilling story of one boy's battle against evil set in an enchanted world of chivalry, courage, and true friendship.

Everything, Everything by Nicola Yoon
The story of a teenage girl who's literally allergic to the outside world. When a new family moves in next door, she begins a complicated romance that challenges everything she's ever known.

Tiny Pretty Things by Sona Charaipotra and Dhonielle Clayton
Three top students at an exclusive Manhattan ballet academy compete for the status of prima ballerina, with each willing to sacrifice, manipulate, and backstab to be the best of the best.

Shadow and Bone by Leigh Bardugo
Alina Starkov is taken to become the protégé of the mysterious Darkling, who trains her to join the magical elite in the belief that she is the Sun Summoner, who can destroy the monsters of the Fold.

Cursed by Thomas Wheeler
An adaptation of the King Arthur myth is told from the perspective of a massacre victim who becomes the Lady of the Lake, destined to reunite an ancient sword with a legendary sorcerer.

The Miseducation of Cameron Post by Emily M. Danforth
In the early 1990s, when gay teenager Cameron Post rebels against her conservative Montana ranch town and her family decides she needs to change her ways, she is sent to a gay conversion therapy center.
